

With deep gratitude, I extend my sincere appreciation to all members of the association, staff members, research fellows, strategic partners, and stakeholders who have continuously supported the work of the Indonesia Judicial Research Society (IJRS). This annual report not only reflects the collective achievements IJRS has accomplished, but also illustrates our ongoing commitment to the organization's vision: a just and rational justice system and legal policy. This vision is pursued through three institutional missions: conducting trusted and high-quality legal and social research based on evidence, supporting stakeholders in addressing strategic legal issues, and empowering communities in the interest of society and the advancement of knowledge in the legal and social fields.

Amidst increasingly complex legal and social dynamics, IJRS, now in its sixth year, has maintained its consistency in producing evidence-based work, impactful policy advocacy, and the strengthening of access to justice—especially for vulnerable groups. Throughout the year, IJRS has collaborated with various institutions, including government ministries and agencies, national and international donors, the judiciary, universities, media, and civil society organizations.

These collaborations have resulted in tangible achievements across priority areas. In criminal procedural law reform, IJRS has contributed to the drafting of the Government Regulation in Lieu of Law (RPP) on the new Criminal Code (KUHP) 2023, the Supreme Court Regulation (PERMA) on terrorism sentencing, and a study on the cost of crime in drug-related cases. In institutional governance, IJRS has supported the development of a prosecutorial human resources system, the drafting of the 2025–2029 National Medium-Term Development Plan (RPJMN), and the measurement of the Legal and Human Rights Development Index.

In the area of vulnerable group protection, IJRS has developed the KataHukum.id platform as a legal information portal, facilitated advocate training in handling sexual violence cases, and conducted studies on sentencing disparities in sexual violence cases. The portal was launched during a mini-festival titled SHElebrate x KataHukum. id as part of the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence campaign. This event served as a significant moment for IJRS to raise public awareness, particularly among millennials and Gen Z, about women's legal rights. IJRS has also been active in the 18+ Coalition for ending child marriage and in advocating for stronger victim assistance funds.

Furthermore, recognizing the importance of civil and commercial legal aspects, IJRS has also promoted civil procedural reform through public seminars and efforts to modernize civil procedure frameworks in the business sector. These initiatives underscore the importance of adapting civil law to the needs of an evolving economy and legal practice—particularly for advocates and state-owned enterprises.

Beyond programmatic achievements, IJRS has continued to strengthen its institutional governance, including branding, financial management, and personnel capacity development. We believe that a strong and sustainable institution is built on a solid foundation of internal governance. The Board of the Association remains committed to guiding IJRS as an adaptive, progressive, and responsive research institution attuned to emerging legal and social issues. IJRS's strategic direction focuses on institutional capacity-building, resource diversification, and expanding impact through relevant and evidence-based research across broader issues.

IJRS continues to position itself as an independent research actor bridging the gap between public policy needs and the voice of civil society. In responding to evolving socio-political dynamics, IJRS aims to remain critical yet constructive in generating knowledge that drives systemic change. We firmly believe the future of the institution depends on its ability to remain open to change while holding steadfast to the founding principles upon which it was built.

This year also marks a key leadership transition at the executive level, in line with our commitment to cadre development and generational regeneration. In July 2024, IJRS officially appointed a new Executive Director, Arsa Ilmi Budiarti, for the 2024–2029



period, succeeding the previous Executive Director, Dio Ashar Wicaksana. This transition strengthens IJRS's organizational structure to respond to the institution's evolving needs. Furthermore, 2024 marks the end of the 2021–2024 IJRS Association Board term. As outlined in the IJRS Articles of Association, all appointments will end on 31 December 2024. Members of the association will be reappointed for the next term. Some existing members will continue, while others will be replaced, based on the institution's needs. This process is essential to ensure sustainable, democratic, and accountable governance in line with IJRS's long-term vision.

On behalf of the IJRS Association Board 2021–2024, I express my deepest gratitude to everyone who has supported IJRS's journey. May this report serve as a meaningful record and a strong foundation for the next generation in building a legal system that is just, transparent, and in service of the public interest.

In July 2024, I was entrusted with the mandate to lead the Indonesia Judicial Research Society (IJRS) as Executive Director for the 2024–2029 term. Building on the leadership that came before, IJRS remains committed to strengthening principles of accountability, transparency, and inclusivity throughout all areas of work. We continue to enhance our internal systems—from the development of standard operating procedures and professional development to mainstreaming diversity and gender equality across the organization. These are not merely institutional obligations, but fundamental values that shape how we work with communities, policymakers, and development partners.

This leadership transition has also served as a moment to consolidate IJRS institutionally—from human resource governance and communications strategies to program planning and digital infrastructure. We recognize that sustainability



can only be achieved through continual system renewal, team regeneration, and ongoing capacity building.

Over the next five years, our strategic focus will center on four key areas: (1) promoting fair and effective criminal justice reform, (2) expanding access to justice, particularly for vulnerable and marginalized groups, (3) advancing institutional legal governance that is transparent, accountable, and inclusive, and (4) cultivating a collaborative and sustainable legal knowledge ecosystem. Amidst shifting political dynamics and funding challenges, we remain confident that our networks, commitment to evidence-based change, and innovative policy approaches will serve as the foundation for systemic transformation.

As part of the civil society movement, we understand that justice reform cannot be achieved alone. Therefore, IJRS will continue strengthening collaboration with a wide range of actors-from public sector institutions and academia to private entities and grassroots communities. We are particularly committed to expanding our partnerships with international allies, including universities, research institutes, and global development organizations. Through these connections, we hope to foster knowledge exchange, enrich research methodologies, and contextualize global best practices for Indonesia's legal landscape.

In closing, I extend my deepest appreciation to IJRS's founders, Advisory and Management Boards, staff, partner organizations, donors, and everyone who has walked alongside us. This mandate is not only about leading an institution—it is about carrying forward the hope for a more people-centered, rational, and justiceoriented legal future for Indonesia.





1. Criminal Justice Reform

This study may serve as a reference to ensure implementing regulations of the 2023 KUHP to be drafted appropriately, especially in connection with the upcoming Draft Law on the Indonesian Criminal Procedural Law Code (Kitab Undang-Undang Hukum Acara Pidana – KUHAP).
2	Coalition for the Draft Law on the Indonesian Criminal Procedural Law Code (Rancangan Kitab Undang-Undang Hukum Acara Pidana - RKUHAP) alongside the Government and Civil Society	IJRS alongside ICJR, LeIP, YLBHI, LBH Jakarta, LBH Masyarakat, etc. are involved in the advocacy to urge revision to KUHAP as a follow-up to the enactment of the 2023 KUHP. This advocacy ensures the availability of an appropriate KUHAP draft to reinforce law enforcement in the future.
3	Study on Community Service Sentence & Probation Sen-tence under the 2023 KUHP	IJRS alongside ICJR and LeIP were involved in a study and drafted an implementing government regulation on Community Service Sentence and Probation Sentence as a follow-up to the 2023 KUHP. This study and draft may be used as a guideline for the enforcement of the type of sentences mandated under the 2023 KUHP.
4	Book Writing and Dissemi- nation of the 2023 KUHP with Provincial Prosecutor's Offices of DKI Jakarta and Bangka Belitung	IJRS partnered with Provincial Prosecutor's Offices of DKI Jakarta and Bangka Belitung to write a commentary book on articles contained in the 2023 KUHP as a reference material for prosecutors to understand and use the 2023 KUHP in future practices.

5	Researching Cost of Crime in Narcotics Cases	IJRS partnered with AIPJ2 and Seknas FITRA, ICJR, LBH Masyarakat, and Lembaga Demografi UI to conduct a research to measure legal costs expended by the government and convicts/ex-convicts and their family when they were undergoing the legal process in narcotics cases. This research may serve as a reference to demonstrate costs and impacts of the criminal legal process that might be time-consuming and costly, hence this requires a reform in both criminal procedure and sentencing in narcotics cases.
6	Monitoring and Evaluating Narcotics Prosecution Guidelines (PED 11/2021 & PED 18/2021)	IJRS conducted a research on the implementation of regulations of the Prosecutor's Office concerning prosecution in narcotics cases. This research aims to reveal supporting and discouraging factors in enforcing those regulations, including the repeal of those regulations. This research may serve as critical reflection and reference for drafting and implementing prosecution guidelines in narcotics cases in the future.
7	Drafting Regulation of the Supreme Court on Narco- tics Sentencing Guideline	IJRS partnered with AIPJ2 and the Supreme Court to draft Regulation of the Supreme Court on Narcotics Sentencing Guideline that may be applied as a guideline for judges to impose more proportional sentencing.
8	Coalition for Draft Law on Narcotics	IJRS alongside the civil society coalition was involved in advocacy to reform the Narcotics Law to urge more proportional sentencing on victimless & non-violent narcotics crimes, urge the existence of an out-of-court criminal dispute resolution mechanism for minor narcotics offenses and urge transparency of narcotics research practices to find the most suitable consumption model for each existing type of narcotics in the future.

9	Drafting Circular of the Supreme Court on Conflict of Interest	IJRS assisted the Supreme Court in deliberation and drafting meetings of SK KMA No. 15/KMA/SK.HK2/II/2025 on Guideline for Prevention and Handling of Conflict of Interest in Adjudicating Cases at the Supreme Court.
10	Monitoring and Evaluating Corruption Sentencing Guideline at the Supreme Court	IJRS partnered with the Open Society Foundation to conduct a research to observe the implementation of the existing Corruption Offense Guideline at the Supreme Court to assess whether the existing guideline is enforceable or not. The result of this monitoring and evaluation may be used as a reference to improve the future corruption sentencing framework.
11	Preparing Draft Govern- ment Regulation & Draft Law on Restorative Justice	IJRS alongside ICJR, LeIP and the Coordinating Ministry for Politics, Law and Human Rights were involved in drafting regulations on restorative justice, as a response to internal regulations on restorative justice being established by various law enforcement institutions, resulting in discrepancy in perception and implementation. The existence of these regulations may be beneficial for more appropriate implementation of restorative justice in the future.
12	Drafting Regulation of the Supreme Court on Terro- rism Sentencing Guideline	IJRS as a member of the Supreme Court Working Group, alongside CDS, drafted an internal regulation of the Supreme Court on terrorism sentencing to ensure more appropriate sentencing in terrorism cases.

Preparing Policy Brief for Draft Regulation of the Prosecutor's Office on Environmental Criminal Offenses against Corpo-

rations

IJRS alongside ICEL were involved in a study and preparation of a policy brief for a prosecution guideline for prosecutors in handling environmental criminal cases where the defendant is a corporation. This policy brief may serve as a future reference for the Prosecutor's Office to draft a guideline or regulation of the Prosecutor's Office in relation to those criminal cases.

Drafting Regulation of the Government under the 2023 KUHP on Commutation of Sentences

IJRS partnered with the Ministry of Law to prepare the Draft Regulation of the Government on the Implementation of KUHP on Commutation of Sentences. During the drafting process of that regulation, IJRS was involved in the process of deliberating issues, preparing an inventory list of issues and drafting the regulation on commutation of sentences in connection with Capital and Life Sentences under the 2023 KUHP

Drafting Regulation of the Government under the 20-23 KUHP on Living Law IJRS partnered with the Ministry of Law to prepare the Draft Regulation of the Government on the Implementation of KUHP on Living Law. During the drafting process of that regulation, IJRS was involved in the process of deliberating issues, preparing an inventory list of issues and drafting the regulation on implementing rules for the living law (pidana adat) under the 2023 KUHP.

Hence, the Draft Regulation of the Government on Employment Management of Prosecutors aims to close the legal gap in the operation

This study is expected to serve as a reference for the Prosecutor's Office and BPDLH and Ministry of Finance to ensure effective management of environmental recovery fund.
9	Preparing the 2025-2029 Strategic Plan of the National Commission on Human Rights (Komisi Nasional Hak Asasi Manusia – Komnas HAM)	IJRS and Komnas HAM were involved in preparing the 2025-2029 Strategic Plan of Komnas HAM as a guideline for Komnas HAM to perform its duties and functions in the sector of advancing and exercising human rights.
10	Reinforcing the Open Government Indonesia	IJRS alongside the Open Government Partnership, National Secretariat for Open Government Indonesia, and civil society coalition for Open Government Indonesia performed a series of measures to reinforce open government Indonesia. IJRS as the Coordinating Secretariat for Open Government Indonesia from the civil society element, alongside other civil society partners, prepared a Draft Presidential Regulation, implemented the National Action Plan, involved in international forums and advocacy to fulfill open government principles in Indonesia.

11 Assisting the Human Rights Index

IJRS partnered with the Directorate General of Human Rights, the Ministry of Law and Human Rights, and Lembaga Demografi Universitas Indonesia to conduct the first human rights indexation in Indonesia that employs the composite method. This human rights index should be used as a reference for achievements in terms of human rights development in Indonesia, and simultaneously be used as an input for improving the future implementation of human rights.

Mainstreaming the Civil
Procedural Law Reform

IJRS and The Asia Foundation held a public seminar on civil procedural law reform which underlines the importance of civil procedural reform amidst various developments taking place currently. In partnership with UMBRA Law, IJRS was also involved in reinforcing the civil procedural law, especially in business sector, by involving advocates and State-Owned Enterprises (*Badan Usaha Milik Negara* – BUMN) to provide inputs based on current practices.


Reinforcing Regulation on Provision of Money and Goods/Advancement of Indonesian Philanthropists

IJRS and Yayasan Penabulu conducted a study and drafted a regulation to advance Indonesian philanthropists and reinforce the framework for providing money and goods to respond current situations in appropriate, transparent and accountable manners. Alongside the Indonesian philanthropist coalition, IJRS encourages revision to the Regulation of the Government on solicitation of money and goods.



3. Protection Of Vulnerable Groups

Activities Description IJRS partnered with CRM to urge the 1 Study on Advocacy Map for Draft Law on Antiestablishment of a regulation on anti-Discrimination discrimination to ensure the existence of a legal framework capable of ensuring the enforcement of anti-discrimination in Indonesia. To ensure that condition, IJRS provided a mapping of key actors and strategic measures which may be taken to make sure that legal framework may be advocated. Developing Kata Hukum IJRS partnered with AIPJ2 and civil society 2 Platform coalition to develop a legal data and information portal branded as "Kata Hukum" (katahukum.id) which aims to provide a onestop portal for legal issues, including the search for legal aid references that are helpful for vulnerable groups undergoing legal issues. This portal is expected to be a community channel for civil society and service providers to effectively and efficiently distribute legal information. Preparing Modules and IJRS partnered with The Asia Foundation, 3 Trainings for Advocates on Peradi and OBH to hold a series of training Law on Sexual Violence activities and prepare materials and modules Offenses (Tindak Pidana on TPKS Law. These activities aim to upgrade Kekerasan Seksual – TPKS) knowledge and understanding of advocates in providing legal aid, especially in relation to sexual violence cases. Modules produced from those activities may be used as reference and guideline for advocates when handling sexual violence cases.

This in-depth study may be beneficial for judges and prosecutors to identify interpretation of articles set out under TPKS Law and the 2023 KUHP which may be exhausted when handling cases.
9	Research on Disparity in Court Decisions in Sexual Violence Cases	IJRS partnered with AIPJ2 to conduct a research on sentencing disparity in court decisions in sexual violence cases. This study highlights the importance of having a proportional and appropriate sentencing and/or handling guideline for sexual violence cases, resulting in minimizing the disparity. This study also serves as a reference for the Supreme Court to reexamine sentencing on sexual offenders, especially with the enactment of TPKS Law.

Performance of organization's work meetings and outing

In 2024, IJRS held two outings to enhance togetherness, strengthen inter-individual relationship among the worker's body, and boost work enthusiasm to encourage productivity and creativity. In addition, on 29 February 2024 – 1 March 2024, Members of the Worker's Body held an Annual Routine Meeting to evaluate Organization's performance for the past year and prepare a work plan for the following year. This audit process aims to assess the level of resources management performed by IJRS, whether it has fulfilled predetermined standards or not, and to identify areas available for improvement. Through the audit, IJRS attempts to provide a guarantee to stakeholders that IJRS is managed by employing high level accountability principles, and its integrity is always upheld in making any decisions and

taking any measures. The result of this audit not only serves as a means to improve the internal process, but also serves as a preventive measure to avoid any deviation potentials which might jeopardize the organization.

Preparation of an internal tax manual book/guideline

As part of sustainable efforts to increase operational efficiency and ensure seamless financial and tax management, the IJRS operational team is currently preparing a Financial and Tax manual book. This manual book is designed to make it easier for the team to carry out its daily operational activities by referring to a clear and systematic guideline on financial management and to comply with prevailing taxation laws. This manual book encompasses various fundamental procedures and steps relating to financial management, tax reporting, and fulfillment of taxation obligations that must be adhered to by every member of the operational team. Up to currently, this manual book is being developed and renewed periodically to create a comprehensive guideline. This manual book is expected to not only beneficial for the operational team, but may also be used by the management team in making strategic decisions relating to financial and taxation management.



2. Reinforcement to Organizational Administration and Procedures

Throughout 2024, IJRS performed a series of activities to make sure an organizational administration that reflects transparency, accountability and integrity. The series of activities includes as follows:

On 5 July 2024, the inauguration of the newly appointed IJRS Executive Director, Arsa Ilmi Budiarti, was held for an office period from 2024 up to 2029. She replaced Adery Ardhan Saputro who previously assumed the position as the Acting Executive Director. The inauguration was held simultaneously with the IJRS Annual Reflection by inviting speakers and guests from representatives of Ministries/ Agencies, Stakeholders, Partners, Civil Society Organizations, and other elements. With the election of new Executive Director, a new organizational structure was also established in support of the organization to operate properly and in line with its vision and missions.



Access to comprehensive and digestible legal information still poses a challenge for many Indonesian people, notwithstanding that proper legal understanding serves as a key element in reinforcing legal culture. Legal understanding covers many aspects, namely awareness, compliance, and public involvement in a just legal system. The existence of transparent and publicly accessible legal information not only functions as an initial step in realizing a more inclusive access to justice, but also plays a vital role in raising legal awareness in the society. In response to the legal culture reinforcement, in 2024, IJRS presented a legal data and information portal called KataHukum.id. KataHukum.id was officially introduced in the commemoration of 16 Days of Anti-Violence Against Women (16 Hari Anti Kekerasan Terhadap Perempuan – 16 HAKTP) in an event named SHElebrate x KataHukum.id which was held on 22-23 November 2024 at HeArt Space 2.0, Jakarta.

Katahukum.id was designed to act as a source of data and information for the society to acquire legal knowledge. **Katahukum.id** constitutes part of legal culture reinforcement by ensuring legal information to be accessible and digestible by all persons. In addition, we also continue rolling out communication strategies via social media to create legal culture reinforcement.

Although **KataHukum.id** has manifested in the form of a legal data and information portal, the existence of social media still holds a crucial role as a means to disseminate information in a broader scope, faster, and more interactive. Social media enables legal information to reach more people, raise massive legal awareness and open a more dynamic and inclusive discussion space.

With hardly any access to legal information in the society as the backdrop, IJRS attempted to present a legal information portal platform that provides information in digestible and accessible format to the society. Hence, IJRS initiated the KataHukum. id portal which was officially introduced on the commemoration of 16 Days of Anti-Violence Against Women (16 Hari Anti Kekerasan Terhadap Perempuan – 16 HAKTP) in an event named SHElebrate x KataHukum.id on 22-23 November 2024 at HeArt Space 2.0, Jakarta, KataHukum.id is also collectively used and managed by other civil society organizations. Currently, we collaborate with PEKKA, Association of LBH APIK Indonesia, Rumah KitaB, ICJ Makassar, Sapda Jogja and LBH Masyarakat.

SHElebrate X KatahuKum.id 2024, which became the launching event of KataHukum.id, adopted the theme of "Raising Awareness and Improving Collaboration to Celebrate Women's Rights". This event was packaged by combining discussions that share various perspectives on protection and handling women suffering from violence and an exhibition of art pieces expressing resistance advocacy messages for women in gaining access to justice. SHElebrate X KatahuKum.id was undoubtedly realized through partnership with various parties, namely supports from 30+ partners, collaboration with 10 artists, and 10+ volunteers, resulting in this event to be successfully organized and attended by more than 200 participants who were actively involved in various sessions. In two days of the event, more than 350 searches gueried on the KataHukum.







Social Media

Social media still becomes one of effective and interactive communication strategies to broadly and quickly disseminate information. Within minutes, the message published may reach larger scope of social media users, enabling the distribution of legal information to be more efficient. Various interactive features are available, such as Direct Message (DM), comment, and Q&A feature on Instagram Story, giving a space for social media users to actively engage, discuss, and receive in-depth understanding. As part of efforts to reinforce the legal culture, we have optimized social media as an educational means, and measured the rate of engagement and interest of social media users in various educational contents that we disseminate.





Sentencing Disparity in Sexual Violence Offenses

Sentencing disparity in Indonesia occurs when two persons committing a similar offense, but convicted with different sentences. Even though not all disparity is considered improper, an issue appears if the sentencing disparity is very far off, frequently triggered by biases or prejudices from judges. We reviewed rape and assault cases against minors and adults in District Courts and Military Courts from 2019 up to 2021, using quantitative and legal normative approaches. The result unveils that irrelevant factors often affect decisions of judges and lead to unwarranted disparity. In the launching of this research, we collaborated with **The** Conversation media to reformat our research output into a brief article and an explainer video to make findings in this research understandable by all members of society. From various contents both produced independently and collaboratively on the issue of sentencing disparity in sexual violence offenses, including media releases, articles, infographics, carousel contents, and explainer videos, those generated engagement of

Civil Society Coalition for Open Government **Indonesia**



On 14 February 2024, Indonesia organized a General Election (Pemilihan Umum - Pemilu), with one of the agenda was to elect the President and Vice President. However, during the campaign, the issue of Indonesian open government still had not become the public center of attention. The commitment to implement Indonesian open government should be an important agenda to be carried out by the current government and carried over by the future government. Moreover, this commitment is necessary to safeguard government transparency principles to continue to be transparent, participating, accountable, inclusive, and innovative. The Civil Society Coalition for Open Government Indonesia consists of 18 (eighteen) Civil Society Organizations, including us, that expresses our concerns on open government by adopting approaches in the form of public discussions and media releases. As part of the commemoration of 16 HAKTP, SHElebrate X KataHukum.id aims to create a reflection, educational, and collaborative space that supports efforts in eradicating violence against women. This mini festival also launched a legal data and information platform for all members of society called KataHukum.id. This context may be extracted from the age demography of followers of the IJRS Instagram account that is mostly dominated by the age group of 25-34 years old at 49.4%.

May and July were months with the highest engagement rates. In May, we had a quite significant momentum, namely the transition of leadership with the election of the new executive director. In July, with a 0.1% higher engagement rate compared to May, we held two events which attracted wide attention, namely Dissemination of IJRS Publication: Criminal Procedural Law Reform After the Enactment of the 2023 KUHP & Assessment of Enforcement of Guideline of the Prosecutor's Office on Handling Narcotics Cases. By observing those data, the highest engagement rate achieved when important information and momentum occurred. We had ever conducted a survey to our social media users, and one of the results shows that our social media users prefer to interact more with contents addressing crucial topics. Perhaps, this becomes one of factors that boosted our engagement rates in May and July.




